This Week

The Omaha hockey team hosts its second NCHC series of the season this weekend, welcoming No. 2 Minnesota Duluth on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 18-19. Both games begin at 7:07 p.m. from Baxter Arena.

The Teams

Omaha is 6-3-1 this season and 3-1-0-0/0 in the NCHC, tying it with Western Michigan for third place. The Mavericks swept their first series of the season last weekend at Miami, winning 6-4 and 6-2. The Mavericks are 2-3-1 at home this season. They are 9-12-2 all-time against Minnesota Duluth including a mark of 7-6-0 in Omaha. UNO has won three straight games, a season high.

Minnesota Duluth is 8-2-2 overall and 5-1-0-0/0 in the NCHC, putting it in first. The Bulldogs split a home series with Western Michigan last weekend, losing 4-3 on Friday before pitching a 2-0 shutout on Saturday. The Bulldogs have gone 2-0-2 on the road this season.

The Coaches

Dean Blais is in his eighth year as the head coach of the Mavericks, having led UNO to three 20-win campaigns in that time. The 1973 graduate of Minnesota has posted a record of 397-234-59 in his career as a head coach and has guided the Mavericks to a mark of 135-119-26.

Blais is a two-time Spencer Penrose Memorial Award winner as the Division I coach of the year and a four-time winner of the WCHA's Coach of the Year Award. He spent 10 years as head coach at North Dakota where he led UND to national championships in 1997 and 2000. He is joined by associate head coach Mike Gabinet, a former UNO defenseman and a 2004 graduate, and assistant coach Leigh Mendelson, a 2015 Omaha graduate and former volunteer assistant coach for the team (2014-16).

Scott Sandelin is in his 17th season as head coach at UMD. The 1986 graduate of North Dakota and former Blais assistant is 295-279-77 in his time behind the Bulldogs' bench. He is assisted by Jason Herter and Brett Larson.

DEAN BLAIS - HEAD COACH

Hometown: International Falls, Minn.

Dean Blais enters his eighth season as the head coach of the Mavericks, having guided them to three 20-wins seasons, two NCAA berths and the school's first trip to the Frozen Four.

In 2015-16, Blais led the Mavericks to a record of 18-17-1 and a mark of 8-15-1-0/0 in their third year in the NCHC, good for sixth place. The Mavericks posted the first perfect non-conference record in school history, going 10-0-0 outside the NCHC while inaugurating play at Baxter Arena with eight straight wins.

Blais came to UNO prior to the 2009-10 season, the Mavericks' final year in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association. In 2010-11, the Mavericks transitioned to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association where they surpassed expectations by finishing third overall and earned an NCAA Tournament berth, just the second in school history. For his efforts, he was named the WCHA Coach of the Year.

Another transition awaited the Mavericks in 2013 as the school joined the newly-formed NCHC and under Blais' guidance, finished in third place in each of the first two seasons. The high point for Blais and the Mavericks came in 2014-15 when they won the school's first NCAA Tournament games, culminating in the NCAA Midwest Regional Championship. They then advanced to Boston for the 2015 Frozen Four, losing to eventual national champion Providence College in the semifinal. That year, Blais was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award and the NCHC Coach of the Year Award.

During his time at UNO, Blais also has served as the head coach of Team USA at the IIHF World Under-20 Junior Championship both in 2010 and 2012, winning the gold medal in 2010. In addition, he has coached two All-Americans at UNO - Ryan Walters (Second Team, 2013) and Josh Archibald (First Team, 2014).

Blais, a native of International Falls, Minn., is a two-time winner of the Penrose Award. Before coming to Omaha, he was the head coach at North Dakota for 10 seasons (1994-2004), leading UND to two national championships and seven NCAA appearances overall. He earned three WCHA Coach of the Year nods while at UND. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach at North Dakota from 1980 to 1989 under Gino Gasparini.

Blais played college hockey at Minnesota from 1969-73 and was an assistant coach there under the legendary Herb Brooks after a short professional career. Blais also was a high school coach and athletic director and served as an assistant coach for Team USA at the Olympic Winter Games in Albertville, France in 1992.

Both games also can be heard live on 1180 The Zone 2. Gary Sharp will handle the play by play on Friday, and Ahlers will call the action on Saturday. Terry Leahy provides analysis, and Lester St. James reports. Coverage begins 30 minutes before game time with the First National Bank Pre-Game Show. Live video is available at NCHC.tv, and live audio and stats can be found at OMavs.com.

Last Weekend Recap

The Mavericks earned their first sweep at Miami last weekend, winning 6-4 and 6-2.

On Friday, Mason Morelli scored a powerplay goal at 7:21 to open the scoring, but the RedHawks reeled off the next four goals to lead by three halfway through the second period. Joel Messner scored his first career goal at 16:15 of the second to draw the Mavericks to within two. Then in the third, UNO pulled away, scoring four more goals. Jake Randolph, Steven Spinner, David Pope and Morelli all scored in the Mavericks' most prolific period of the season. Evan Weninger made 24 saves in the win.

The next night, the Mavericks jumped out to a 2-0 lead on a powerplay goal by Morelli and a shorthanded tally from Austin Ortega, but Miami's Kiefer Sherwood scored two powerplay goals to tie the game at the intermission. In the second, Luc Snuggerud scored with the teams playing four-on-four, and Pope added a five-on-three powerplay marker to put the Mavericks up 4-2 at the break. In the third, Ortega scored on a breakaway, and Snuggerud scored his second on a power play to complete the scoring. Weninger was again the winner in goal with 23 saves.

Briefly

• Seniors Austin Ortega and Ian Brady, and junior Luc Snuggerud led the Mavericks in scoring against Miami with four points each. Ortega and Snuggerud each had two goals and two assists while Brady had four assists.

- Three other players had three points against the RedHawks: Mason Morelli (three goals), David Pope (2-1-3) and Steven Spinner (1-2-3).
- During their three game winning streak, the Mavericks have scored six goals in each game.
- Omaha’s first sweep at Miami came in its 11th trip to Oxford dating back to their time in the CCHA.
- The Mavericks have had a 2-0 lead in six of the 10 games they’ve played this season and are 4-1-1 in those games.
- UNO’s last road sweep was Oct. 16-17, 2015 at Vermont.
- For all games played, the Mavericks rank second in the NCHC in offense, averaging 3.90 goals for per game. They are fifth in team defense, averaging three goals per game.
- The Mavericks have scored first in eight of their 10 games played. Mason Morelli leads the team with four first goals.
- The Mavericks are unbeaten in their last five games against Minnesota Duluth, going 3-0-2 with two shootout wins in that time. Last year, the two teams played just twice with the Mavericks earning back-to-back 4-2 wins at Baxter Arena on Nov. 6-7.

Weekly Hardware

Senior Austin Ortega and junior Luc Snuggerud were named NCHC offensive and defensive players of the week on Nov. 14, making them the first Mavericks to win weekly awards this season. It was the fourth weekly award for Ortega in his career and the first for Snuggerud.

Both players had two goals and two assists in a weekend sweep at Miami on Nov. 11-12.

One To Go

Senior Austin Ortega had the game-winning goal against Colorado College on Nov. 5, his second game-winner of the season and the 22nd of his career. He is now just one from tying the NCAA record held by Colorado College’s Brett Sterling (2003-06) and Minnesota’s Kyle Rau (2012-15).

Ortega has led the NCAA in game winners in each of the last two seasons. He had an NCAA-record 11 during the 2014-15 season and put up eight more last year.

Goals For The Season

Ortega scored UNO’s only goal in a 2-1 loss to Colorado College on Nov. 4, but it was a milestone night for the senior. The goal was his 100th career point, making him the 15th Maverick to reach that mark. He currently ranks first in the NCHC with 107 career points.

Ortega leads the team with nine goals this season and now has 59 in his career. That includes a career-best 21 last season.

Ortega is tops among active UNO players with 21 career power-play goals and ranks fifth all-time in school history. He is just five from tying the school record held by Brandon Scero.

The native of Escondido, Calif. ranks highly on UNO’s career charts. He moved into fourth all-time in career goals after notching two at Miami on Nov. 11-21 and is tied for 12th all-time in points. He is tied with Scott Parse for third in goals per game (0.50).

Climbing the Charts

With four assists at Miami on Nov. 11-12, senior Ian Brady moved up to fourth all-time in points by a UNO defenseman with 65. He is just three points from catching Michael Young (2010-14) for third in school history.

With 13 career goals, he is tied with Young and Bryce Aneloski for fourth all-time, needing two to catch Andrej Sustr in third. His 52 career assists rank fifth and put him just one from tying Eric Olimb for fourth.

Powerful

The Mavericks have scored a power play goal in all 10 games they’ve played this season and lead the NCAA with a success rate of 32.7 percent (18/55).

Remarkably, the Mavericks already have had a season-high three powerplay goals in two games this season - in a 5-1 win over UMass Lowell on Oct. 28; and in a 6-2 win at Miami on Nov. 12.

Last season, the Mavericks ranked seventh in the NCHC and 38th nationally with a power play success rate of 16 percent.

Joining the Club

On Nov. 5, David Pope had four assists in the Mavericks’ 6-4 win over Colorado College, tying a school

record. The last time a player had four assists in a game was Matt White at Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 16, 2013. Pope became the 10th Maverick all-time to record four assists in a game. It's now happened 13 times with Bryan Marshall (3) and Scott Parse (2) doing so multiple times.

A Rare Occurrence

On Oct. 29, UMass Lowell's Jake Kamrass scored on a penalty shot against Evan Weninger. It marked the first penalty shot goal surrendered by an Omaha goaltender since Western Michigan's Pat Dwyer scored against Dan Ellis on Nov. 1, 2002 at Kalamazoo, Mich.

Remarkably, Ellis had allowed another penalty shot goal the prior week when Boston University's Gregg Johnson scored on Oct. 25, 2002 in Boston.

In between Dwyer and Kamrass' goals, UNO goaltenders had faced only four penalty shots, stopping all of them. Prior to the Kamrass goal, the last penalty shot faced was on Nov. 22, 2013 when Ryan Massa stopped Miami's Austin Czarnik.

Happy Anniversary

Omaha is celebrating the 20th season of Division I hockey this season. The Mavericks made their debut in 1997-98 as an independent under the leadership of Mike Kemp. The school transitioned to the Central Collegiate Hockey Association in 1999-2000 and reached the CCHA Final Four that same season, losing in the championship game to Michigan State.

The Mavericks played in the CCHA for 11 seasons before moving to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association for three years (2010-13) and then becoming charter members of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference.

Omaha has an all-time record of 329-342-83 and a 200-205-63 mark in conference play. The Mavericks have appeared in the NCAA playoffs three times in their history, advancing to the Frozen Four for the first time in 2015. They have never won a conference regular season title or post-season tournament crown.

Going To The Polls

The Mavericks are receiving votes in this week's top-20 poll from USCHO.com. NCHC teams occupy five spots with Denver at No. 1 followed by Minnesota Duluth (2), defending national champion North Dakota (8), St. Cloud State (12) and Western Michigan (18).

The Mavericks also are receiving votes in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine top-15 poll released on Nov. 14. DU, UMD, UND and SCSU all appear in the same positions in that poll with Western Michigan receiving votes. Both polls appear on this page.

Speaking of Polls

Omaha was picked to finish fifth in the NCHC in the annual preseason poll of media who cover the conference's eight schools, earning 119 points in the voting. It is the third time in the four-year history of the poll that the Mavericks have been slotted in the bottom half of the conference.

Prior to the NCHC's inaugural season, the Mavericks were picked eighth but finished third as they did the following year when they were picked sixth. They were chosen fourth prior to last season and finished sixth in the conference.

North Dakota was picked first this season, earning 25 first-place votes and 235 points. Denver was second with three first-place votes and 200 points, and Minnesota Duluth was third with the other two first-place votes and 173 points. The entire poll can be found on the previous page.

A Spot on the Team

Ortega was named to the NCHC Preseason All-Conference Team on Sept. 20, the first Maverick to earn a spot on the team since the conference began. He, along with North Dakota's Brock Boeser and Denver's Dylan Gambrell, were the three forwards on the team while Denver's Will Butcher and Miami's Louie Belpedio were the defensemen. North Dakota's Cam Johnson was the preseason all-conference goalie.

Nearing 100

Omaha has three juniors who should reach 100 career games played this season. Defenseman Luc Snuggerud and forwards Jake Randolph and Tyler Vesel all have played in 84 career games, each having missed just one game in their first two seasons at UNO.

Among current players, Ortega leads the Mavericks with 119 career games followed by fellow seniors Ian Brady (113) and Justin Parizek (106). Parizek has missed the last four games due to injury.

A Full Calendar

By participating in the 2016 Brice Alaska Goal Rush tournament on Oct. 14-15, the Mavericks will play 36 games this season instead of the NCAA-mandated 34. All games played in Alaska are exempt from that total.

In addition to their 24-game NCHC schedule, the Mavericks will play 12 non-conference games beginning with Alaska Anchorage and Alaska in the Goal Rush. Their other non-conference series include:

Last season, the Mavericks were 10-0-0 in non-conference play, the first time they had gone undefeated outside their conference.

Within the NCHC, the Mavericks will play five teams four times each (home-and-home). They will travel to St. Cloud State on Dec. 9-10, but the Huskies do not visit Omaha this season. The Mavericks host Western Michigan on Feb. 10-11 but do not travel to Kalamazoo.

Closing In On 400

Head Coach Dean Blais is just three wins from earning his 400th career victory. He owns a career record of 397-234-59 including a record of 135-119-26 in Omaha.

Blais began the season tied with Cornell's Mike Schafer for ninth among active Division I coaches in wins.

New Faces Behind The Bench

Blais is assisted by two new coaches this season. Former Maverick defenseman Mike Gabinet joined the staff as the associate head coach, and Leigh Mendelson was hired as assistant coach after two seasons as a volunteer coach.

Gabinet was the head coach at NAIT in Edmonton, Alberta where he led the Oaks to a 36-0-0 season and the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference Championship in 2015-16. He was named the ACAC Coach of the Year and the first rookie head coach to guide his team to the conference title since 2005-06. Before last season, he was the associate coach at NAIT for three seasons.

Gabinet was a standout defenseman for the Mavericks from 2000-04, playing in 130 career games and earning 47 points to rank ninth all-time in defenseman scoring.

Mendelson had extensive junior hockey and pro coaching experience before joining the UNO staff. He was an assistant coach for the Omaha Lancers while working alongside former Maverick associate head coach and current Minnesota State head coach Mike Hastings. He helped the Lancers win the Clark Cup in 2001 and 2008 and also had USHL stops as an assistant in Green Bay, Sioux City and Waterloo. He coached professionally in the American Hockey League in Norfolk where he was a head coach, in the ECHL in Atlantic City and Utah as an assistant, and in both Italy and Finland.

Another Small Senior Class

For the second year in a row, the Mavericks have just three seniors on their roster. Austin Ortega, Justin Parizek and Ian Brady all represent the class of 2017. All three made their collegiate debut at home against Bentley on Oct. 11, 2013. Ortega had quite a start to his career, registering a goal and an assist against the Falcons, although the Mavericks ultimately lost the game, 6-4.

The Newbies

The Mavericks bring seven freshmen into the fold this season including four forwards, two defensemen and a goaltender. Incoming d'men Ryan Jones and Dean Stewart were both taken in the 2016 NHL Entry Draft, Jones by Pittsburgh in the fourth round and Stewart by Arizona in the seventh round. In addition, Kris Oldham was taken by Tampa Bay in the sixth round in 2015.

Three of the freshmen are Americans (Oldham - Anchorage, Alaska; Zach Jordan - Collinsville, Ill.; Jones - Crown Point, Ind.), three are Canadian (Colin Grannary - Delta, British Columbia; Tristan Keck - Morris, Manitoba; Stewart - Portage la Prairie, Manitoba) and one is from Finland (Teemu Pulkkinen - Kirkkonummi, Finland).

Four freshmen are graduates of the United States Hockey League (Pulkkinen - Sioux City; Jones - Lincoln; Jordan - Des Moines; Oldham - Omaha) while the others played in the Canadian junior leagues (Grannary - Merritt/BCHL; Stewart - Portage/MJHL; Keck - Winkler/MJHL).

Draft Picks

This season, Omaha has eight players who have been chosen in the NHL Entry Draft. During the most recent draft in June of 2016, freshmen Ryan Jones (Pittsburgh, fourth round, 121st) and Dean Stewart (Arizona, seventh round, 188th) were both selected. In addition, classmate Kris Oldham was chosen by Tampa Bay in the sixth round, 153rd, in the 2015 draft.

Sophomores Fredrik Olofsson (Chicago, fourth round, 98th) and Steven Spinner (Washington, sixth round, 159th) were both taken in the 2014 draft as were juniors Luc Snuggerud (Chicago) and Tyler Vesel (Edmonton). Junior David Pope was selected by Detroit in the 2013 draft.

Baxter Attendance

Not surprisingly, Baxter Arena was just as big a draw as the Mavericks in its first year of operation. The Mavericks averaged 6,918 fans for 18 home games in 2015-16, ranking fourth in the NCAA. The average was up almost 700 fans per game from their last season at the CenturyLink Center Omaha. Omaha has finished in the top six in attendance in each of the last five seasons including three seasons in fourth.

Baxter Arena is the sixth-largest venue for college hockey in the NCAA at 7,898, ranking just ahead of Boston College's Conte Forum (7,884). It also is the second-largest building in the NCHC behind North Dakota's Ralph Engelstad Arena (11,634).

A Bunch of Smart Kids

Last season, 15 upperclassmen were named to the NCHC Academic All-Conference team for achieving at least a 3.0 grade-point average. Seven of those players - Grant Gallo, Jake Guentzel, Justin Parizek, Aaron Pearce, Luc Snuggerud, Kirk Thompson and Tyler Vesel - were named members of the NCHC Scholar-Athlete Team for earning a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better.

In June, all 10 freshmen were named to the Academic All-Conference Team with Alex Blankenburg, Lukas Buchta, Ryan Galt, Jordan Klehr and Mason Morelli also making the Scholar-Athlete Team.

The Mavericks led the NCHC with all 25 team members named to the Academic All-Conference Team.

Games On The Tube

The 2016-17 season promises to be one of the most watched seasons of Omaha hockey. Eleven games will air on local, regional and national television this season. The Mavericks will appear on CBS Sports Network, the NCHC's premiere television partner, on Jan. 27 at Denver and on March 3 when they host Denver.

They also will appear on American Sports Network four times - Oct. 21 vs. Vermont, Dec. 2 at Wisconsin, Jan. 7 vs. North Dakota and Jan. 13 at Colorado College. NET, Nebraska's PBS, will show four home games including Nov. 18 vs. Minnesota Duluth, Jan. 6 vs. North Dakota, Jan. 21 vs. Miami and Feb. 10 vs. Western Michigan.

Fox College Sports will pick up the NET games for redistribution through its regional affiliates on Nov. 18 and Jan. 21 and will do the same for UNO's road game at North Dakota on Feb. 25.
